

Part 7. Storing of Debris

307.01. **Definitions.** The following words used in this ordinance shall, in addition to the usual meanings thereof, include the following meanings: "Person" shall mean and include, corporation, partnership, association, firm or any other legal entity. "Debris" shall mean and include garbage, refuse, used or broken lumber, wreckage from buildings or other structure used or broken or junked automobiles, trucks or dismantled parts or bodies thereof, including tires, old or junk iron or other junk material, and old, used or second hand machinery and equipment of any type.

307.02. **Junk Vehicles.** No person shall place, park, permit to remain, store or leave upon an open space area of any premises any motor vehicle unless it conforms to all of the following requirements.

- (a) The vehicle must have affixed to it a valid current motor vehicle license.
- (b) The vehicle must not lack essential parts that would render it inoperable.
- (c) The vehicle must not be in a rusted, wrecked, partially dismantled or junked condition.

307.03. **Purpose.** It shall be unlawful for any person of any type to keep, deposit or store any debris on any premises within the City of Hayfield unless it is kept within a building and is so kept or stored therein as to prevent any danger of fire and so as not to be injurious to health and safety and so as not to be in violation of any other ordinance or law.

307.04. **Exclusions.** This ordinance shall not apply to garbage kept within covered metal or plastic fly-proof containers and which is periodically removed and disposed of at intervals not exceeding one week. This ordinance, insofar as it applies to junk material, shall not apply to junk dealers licensed under an Ordinance of the City of Hayfield.

307.05. **Removal and Disposal.** The city may cause any such debris kept, or placed or stored in violation of this ordinance to be removed or disposed of at the expense of the owner of premises upon which such debris is located, and the city clerk shall, at the time of certifying the cities levy of taxes to the County Auditor, certify the cost and expense of such disposing and removing of said debris to the County Auditor who shall extend the same on the tax roll of the county against said premises, and it shall be collected by the County Treasurer and paid to the city as other taxes are collected and paid.

307.06. **Penalty.** Any person who violates any of the provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) or imprisonment in the county jail for a period of not to exceed ninety (90) days or both. Each day such violation shall continue shall constitute a separate offense.
