

Part 8. Sanitary Landfill

Amended with Part 12 – 10/17/05

~~308.01. **Definitions.** As used in this section, the terms shall mean the following:~~

~~–Subd. 1. **Resident.** "Resident" mean persons who have a voting residence in the City of Hayfield, Minnesota, or are firms or corporations who are taxpayers in the city and including churches or other non-profit corporations located in the city.~~

~~–Subd. 2. **Non-Resident.** "Non-Resident" means all persons, firms, private and municipal corporations, who do not qualify as a resident as defined above.~~

~~–Subd. 3. **Person.** "Person" includes a natural person of either sex, co-partnership corporations and associates of persons and the agent or manager of aforesaid. The singular number includes the plural and the masculine includes the feminine and neuter.~~

~~–Subd. 4. **Garbage.** "Garbage" means all decomposable and putrescent solid wastes, including materials resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking and consumption of food, every accumulation of animal, fruit, vegetable, fish and derivative wastes from the processing, preparation, manufacture, serving, cooking, consumption, storage or handling of animals, fish, fowl, fruits and vegetables and all related food products. The term also includes all disposable paper and plastic articles, containers and wrappers which have been contaminated by containing or by serving of foods or beverages including but not limited to paper plates, cups, napkins, portion cups, butter cups and cottage cheese, milk and ice cream cartons. The term also includes all other materials which might attract insects or rodents, and includes cans, bottles, crates and boxes, but excluding human excrements, sewage and other water-carried wastes.~~

~~–Subd. 5. **Industrial Waste.** "Industrial Waste" means all organic and inorganic wastes except garbage resulting from any manufacturing, building repairing, demolition, construction, processing, grain cleaning, the operation of garages and service stations and other similar activities.~~

~~308.02. **Location of Sanitary Landfill.** Hayfield maintains a sanitary landfill located in the northern portion of Hayfield described as follows:~~

~~Commencing at the Northeast corner of Block One (1), Grandview Addition, City of Hayfield, thence North eight (8) rods, thence West to the East edge of the Chicago and Great Western Railroad Company right of way (now abandoned), thence South eight (8) rods thence East to the point of beginning, Southeast Quarter (SE1/4), Section 15, Township 105, Range 17, Hayfield, Dodge County, Minnesota.~~

~~308.03. **Purpose.** The purpose of this ordinance is to maintain and protect the health, safety, comfort and repose of the public by regulations of sanitation and operation of the sanitary landfill.~~

308.04. ~~Deposit of Material Restricted.~~

- ~~a. — No persons shall deposit, cause to be deposited, place or put any item in sanitary landfill except as specifically authorized under Section 308.05 hereof.~~
- ~~b. — The City Sanitary Landfill shall be primarily for the use and convenience of residents of the City of Hayfield and shall not be for the use by the general public except as herein provided. The city council may permit use by non-residents upon payment of the fees in compliance with the regulations adopted by the council but the use of non-residents may be terminated or prohibited at any time by the city council without cause.~~

308.05. ~~Materials Deposited.~~ Allowable materials to be placed at sanitary landfill are:

- ~~a. — Tree branches;~~
- ~~b. — Leaves;~~
- ~~c. — Brush;~~
- ~~d. — Burnable wood without nails, and shingles without nails, but wood shall not have attached or affixed any other material.~~

308.06. ~~List of Items Specifically Excluded.~~ This list is not considered all inclusive, but only as an example of some of the things that are prohibited to be placed in the sanitary landfill. Only those things specifically included in Section 308.05 above are authorized to be placed in the sanitary landfill. Items prohibited from being placed in the sanitary landfill include, but are not limited to:

- ~~a. — Tires;~~
- ~~b. — Materials which are inherently dangerous;~~
- ~~c. — Garbage;~~
- ~~d. — Industrial waste;~~
- ~~e. — Any chemicals;~~
- ~~f. — Live ammunition or other explosives or corrosive acids or alkalis;~~
- ~~g. — Glass, aluminum or metal containers;~~
- ~~h. — Newspapers or magazines;~~
- ~~i. — Sewage treatment wastes, ashes, incinerator ash, and incinerator residue;~~
- ~~j. — Toxic or hazardous wastes including, but not limited to, — poisons, pesticides, herbicides, acids, caustics, pathological wastes, radioactive materials, flammable or explosive materials and similar harmful chemicals and wastes which require special handling and must be disposed of in a manner to conserve the environment and protect the public health and safety;~~
- ~~k. — Inorganic refuse in a liquid or semi-liquid state, such as sludge from automobile wash racks, mud, water from laundry and paint sludge;~~
- ~~l. — Newsprint, glass bottles, jars, aluminum cans or other recyclable materials.~~

308.07. ~~Hours.~~ The City Sanitary Landfill shall be operated only between the hours of Nine O'clock A.M. and Three O'clock P.M. on the following days: ~~Wednesday and Saturday.~~ The City Council shall have by resolution the power to change said hours.

~~308.08. **Fee Schedule.** The following fee schedule shall be maintained:~~

- ~~a. — There shall be no charge for a non-commercial individual disposing of one pick-up load or less of permitted material per month. All permitted materials to be disposed of shall originate within the City of Hayfield.~~
- ~~b. — Large Loads: In order to dispose of any larger load than one pick-up per month, a special use permit shall be obtained from the City Council before any disposal and a fee paid not to exceed \$300.00 for each load.~~
- ~~c. — The City Council may by Resolution change the fees and license requirements for disposal which shall become effective after being published once in the official city paper.~~
- ~~d. — No fires shall be allowed to be in sanitary landfill unless authorized by the Hayfield City Council. No person shall dispose of anything upon the property if said disposal or operation is in violation of any rule or regulation of the State of Minnesota including the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency.~~

~~308.09. **Restrictions.** No person, firm or corporation shall be permitted to trespass, pick over or remove items or materials from the dump unless they have first obtained written permission from the council. No person shall dump, leave, deposit or abandon any scrapped or junked automobile, truck or other propelled vehicle or parts thereof, nor refrigerators, cabinets or any other metallic appliances, machinery or household furniture or rubber.~~

~~308.10. **Severability.** Every provision of this ordinance is declared separable from every other provision and if one provision be held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any other provision. The city council shall have the power to establish regulations for the use of sanitary landfill including but not limited to rates, hours of use, method of disposal, types and classes of materials to be deposited and other rules and restrictions for the public's safety, welfare and convenience and connections therewith, which regulations may be different for residents and non-residents. The council may amend such regulations at any time and from time to time by written resolution duly adopted in a conspicuous place at the sanitary landfill. Any failure to keep such notice posted shall not be a defense to any prosecution for violation of any provision of this ordinance or a regulation adopted pursuant to this section of this ordinance.~~

~~308.11. **Penalty.** Any person violating this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$700.00 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days or both.~~
