

Part 7. Curfew

507.01. **Age.** Subdivision 1. Except as provided in Subd. 2, no person under the age of 16 years shall be in any vehicle or upon the public streets, avenues, alleys, parks, or other public places in the City of Hayfield, or in any place of entertainment, business, etc. after the hour of 10:00 p.m. and before the hour of 5:00 a.m. of the following day.

Subd. 2. **Exceptions.** The restrictions do not apply when the minor:

- a. Is accompanied by parent, guardian, or other person having the minor's lawful care, custody, or control;
- b. Is returning home by a direct route from and within 30 minutes after a school activity or an activity of a religious or other voluntary association when prior notice of the activity and its place and probable time of termination has been given to the police department by an adult person authorized by the school or the religious or voluntary association to do so;
- c. Is carrying a certified card of employment and is on the way to or from the minor's place of employment; or
- d. Is upon an emergency errand or other legitimate business directed by parent, guardian, or other adult having the lawful custody of the minor.

507.02. **Permitting Children to Loiter.** It shall be unlawful for any parent, guardian, or other person having the care and custody or control of any child under the age of 16 years to permit such child to violate section 507.01.

507.03. **Loitering of Children Under 18 Years of Age.** It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 18 years to loiter, loaf, or idle upon the streets, avenues, alleys, parks or other public places within the city after the hour of 12:00 midnight and before the hour of 5:00 A.M. unless accompanied by the parent, guardian, or other adult person having the care, custody, or legal control of said person.

507.04. **Penalty.** Any person, firm, or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not to exceed \$1000.00 or imprisoned in the county jail for not to exceed 90 days, or both.
