## Hayfield Community Pool 2020 Guidelines

7/25/20

- ❖ The pool will open at 1:00 pm on Monday, June 15<sup>th</sup>
- ❖ STAY HOME IF YOU ARE SICK.
- ❖ All fees, dates, and pool hours are subject to change without notice.
- ❖ These guidelines can be changed without notice.
- ❖ All fees are non-refundable
  - Family Season Pass - \$110.00 (up to 6 family members)
  - Single Season Pass - \$55.00
  - Lap Swim Season Pass - \$25.00
  - Daily Pass - \$3.00 (can be used throughout each session)
  - Daily Lap Swim Pass - \$1.00
- ❖ Different colored daily wrist bands will be given out to members and non-members. That wrist band is good for all sessions that day.
- ❖ No swimming lessons will be offered in 2020.
- ❖ No pool parties (private parties) will be offered in 2020.
- ❖ The maximum per session capacity will be 80 swimmers.
- ❖ Patrons will be asked to sign-in with their full name. Daily logs will be kept on file.
- ❖ Patrons are asked to arrive in their swimsuits and leave in their swim suits. There will be no access to changing rooms.
- ❖ **Hours of operation**
  - Noon to 1:00 pm - Lap Swim (weekdays only)
  - 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm - Open Swim (80 person max), baby pool open
  - 3:00 pm to 3:30 pm - Closed for cleaning
  - 3:30 pm to 5:00 pm - Open Swim (80 person max), baby pool open
  - 5:00 pm to 6:00 pm - Lap Swim (weekdays only)
  - 6:00 pm to 6:30 pm - Closed for cleaning
  - 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm - Open Swim (80 person max), baby pool open

- ❖ Social Distancing according to MDH guidelines will be strictly enforced. Those choosing to not follow the guidelines will be asked to leave.
- ❖ **EFFECTIVE 7/25/20 – Masks are required for ALL swimmers and non-swimmers. If you are inside the fenced pool area and NOT in the water, you MUST wear a mask. Lifeguards in chairs are exempt from this rule. Masks will be worn by ALL PEOPLE inside the pool house whether you're a worker or a patron. Children 5 and under are exempt from this rule.**
- ❖ When entering the pool building, exiting pool building, using slides, or diving boards, please comply with the 6 foot distance rule.
- ❖ The changing rooms are a “walk-thru” one-person at a time area. Patrons will be asked to shower before using the pool. No gathering will be allowed.
- ❖ There will be no deck chairs on the deck in 2020.
- ❖ All patrons are encouraged to wear masks when not in the water.
- ❖ Non-swimmers must remain behind the fence and are advised to bring their own lawn chairs. Non-swimmers will be asked to comply with the 6 foot social distancing rule when observing from behind the fence unless they are from the same family.
- ❖ Those using the baby pool must comply with the 6 foot social distancing rule.
- ❖ There will be no access to lockers in 2020. The city of Hayfield is not responsible for lost or stolen items.
- ❖ No food or drink is allowed inside the pool area or the changing rooms.
- ❖ No toys, floaties, balls, goggles, lifejackets, or diving toys will be allowed.
- ❖ Pool bathrooms are for pool patrons only.
- ❖ Desk attendants will be asked to wear masks.

**The goal is to make your pool time as enjoyable and safe as possible. To ensure this, your help, patience, and understanding, along with common sense, adjustability, and respect for others will ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all.**
